



#### **Project Description**

Insurance for Rural Resilience and Economic Development (INSURED), a five-year technical assistance programme implemented by IFAD and financed by Sida, aimed at promoting climate insurance as a crosscutting tool in rural development initiatives. The overall objective of INSURED was to protect the incomes of rural women and men and to promote investment in smallholder agriculture.

In collaboration with Busara, M31 Research collected Quantitative and Qualitative data using Computer Assisted Telephone Interviews (CATI) of 600 panel respondents and in-field Focus Group Discussions (FGD) with 90 participants over a 3 year period. After a five (5) day training workshop, a team of 6 enumerators was hired to collect data from beneficiary farmers of the INSURED project.

#### **Project Description**

GIZ was commissioned by the German Ministry of Economic Cooperation and Development to implement a multi-sectoral Special Initiative "ONE WORLD - No Hunger" that aims to sustainably eradicate hunger and malnutrition. Under the framework of this Special Initiative, the Green Innovation Centres (GIC) project in Zambia aims to boost the incomes of small-scale farmers, create employment opportunities, and increase local food supply through the promotion of and training in innovations

GIC conducts an annual impact assessment to measure progress on its productivity, income, and adoption indicators. M31 Research prepared and implemented surveys on behalf of GIC, as well as analysed and reported on the collected data at household level for groundnuts, soya beans and dairy in Eastern and Southern Province of Zambia.

#### **Project Description**

The Local Government Revenue Initiative (LoGRI) of the International Centre for Tax and Development (ICTD) commissioned a property survey in Mansa district of Zambia, to develop policy-relevant research and tools to help local governments collect more local revenue, more equitably and fairly, and in ways that promote trust, transparency and accountability.

M31 Research hired 20 enumerators that visited 2,200 properties in Mansa, stratified by neighbourhoods, and collect external property characteristics.

Each team selected households near randomly generated GPS points following a "controlled" random walk approach and walk from one property to the other until the target number of properties was met.

### **Project Description**

Catholic Care for Children in Zambia (CCCZ) is an initiative, led by the Catholic sisters, to see children growing up in safe, nurturing families. CCCZ works with childcare facilities to share strategies around prevention and integration and provides training on case management, child protection and psychosocial support. The project's Goal is "To improve the well-being of Children in Zambia by providing and promoting long-term and positive family and family like-care and protection". The end-of-project evaluation assessed the extent to which project activities and objectives were attained. The evaluation used a mixed methods research design to collect and analyse data from the project beneficiaries and stakeholders. M31 Research produced the final evaluation report that identified the project's relevancy, effectiveness, efficiency, and impact and offered recommendations for project scale-up.
